A. Review and discuss Article 21.09 Signs.

Chairperson Childress mentioned that Member Torres had sent and discussed with him at length his version of the rewording of Section 21.09.016(p), *Signs advertising alcoholic beverages*. Member Tedder stated that Member Torres had also sent hit the same thing. A majority of the Committee decided to revisit that particular section of the Sign Ordinance again.

The Committee also discussed vehicle signs and wall signs.

*THIRD MOTION:* Accept the wording for vehicle sign as presented by Secretary Kintz and include the wording, "that is currently licensed and registered by the State" in between the first words "structure" and "and".

MOTION CARRIED: (7-0)

The Committee made the following recommendations to Section 21.09.006:

1. Vehicle sign (also vehicular sign/vehicular wrap). A sign that is mounted on or attached to or painted on a vehicle, trailer or otherwise wheeled or mobile structure that is currently licensed and registered with the State, and such mobile structure is parked and is visible from public rights-of-way on a regular basis or for any period exceeding twenty-four (24) hours; including statues or figures or sign objects situated on a trailer or other wheeled device; does not include signs that are being transported to a site where they will be permanently erected, and does not include vehicle magnetic signs including those that will fit on a door or fender panel and including roof-mounted signs that are no taller than twelve inches (12") taller than the vehicle's roof (e.g., "Taxi," "(name of business) Delivery," etc.).

2. Wall sign:

Change six (6) inches to twelve (12) inches in the second line of the definition.

(2) Delete "in aggregate".

(4) Placement/setbacks, shall read as follows:

On the vertical face only of a building; must be comprised of individual letters/characters, panels or boxes; must be attractively designed in any of the eight basic colors (black, blue, brown, green, orange, red, white and yellow); i.e., no bright, neon or otherwise visually intrusive colors for the predominant portion of the sign, such as the background; and must be professionally designed, constructed and applied by an experienced sign contractor.
