The Invocation was provided by Chaplain Dennis Childress. Mayor Sexton led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Sexton reported on the Community Relations Board meeting he recently attended; trip to Austin; and Career Day at Central Elementary.

Mayor Sexton stated a proclamation had been issued recognizing March 17-23, 2013 as *Poison Prevention Week*.

Mayor Sexton presented a proclamation and plaque thanking Debra Hitt for almost 30 years of service to the City of Seagoville as the Senior Center Director. Mayor Sexton announced there would be a reception in her honor immediately following the meeting.

CONSENT AGENDA.

Approve Resolution No. 07-R-13 cancelling the general municipal election for the City of Seagoville set for Saturday, May 11, 2013; certifying candidates unopposed on the ballot for election of Mayor, Councilmember Place 2 and Councilmember Place 4; declaring unopposed candidates elected to office; authorizing copy of Resolution posted on election date at the polling place to be used in election; providing an effective date.
- 3C. Approve Resolution No. 08-R-13 authorizing the Mayor to sign a contract with Dallas Area Agency for Aging for the reimbursement of congregate meals and a program grant for the Senior Citizens Activities and Transportation (SSCAT) Program for fiscal year October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013.

ITEM 4. A PowerPoint presentation was received from Seagoville Economic Development President/CEO Bekki Roberts on current projects including the Ace Hardware Store and Downtown buildings.

ITEM 5. Councilman Landess made a motion, seconded by Councilman Childress, to approve Resolution No. 09-R-13 preserving 2nd Amendment rights to protect and defend the constitutional rights to keep and bear arms. Discussion followed. A vote was cast 4 in favor, 1 against (Day).

ITEM 6. COUNCILMEMBER REPORTS.

Harold Magill – commented on National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA); HB149 NDAA Nullification in Texas; and requested a Resolution be placed on a future agenda supporting HB149.

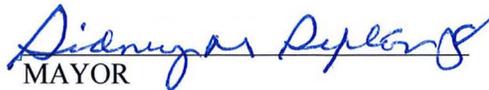
