Liz Gant shared that the Library has not been as busy as normal due to the local schools testing. Liz Gant advised that there were 124 volunteers at the Trash Off. Liz Gant expressed a special thank you to the CPA Alumni for taking care of Malloy Bridge Road from the highway to Seagoville Villas.

Patrick Harvey passed a copy of the Popular Annual Financial Report for attendees to view. Patrick Harvey advised that the City won the Distinguished Budget Award from the G.F.O.A. and is going for the Texas State Comptroller's Office Transparency Award.

Todd Gilcrease shared that he is in the testing process to fill the two open firefighter positions.

Pat Stallings advised that UCR part one crimes are down from this time last year. Pat Stallings shared that he gives credit to citizens and public works notifying the police of suspicious persons and/or activity. Pat Stallings stated that new mobile video systems from WatchGuard have been installed in the patrol units. The new video systems automatically download to our secure computer server and are kept for at least 120 days per squad car.

Cindy Kintz shared statistical data about building projects in the Highland Meadows addition. Cindy Kintz advised that Catfish Corral and Wendy's are operating under new ownership and Serrano Surplus Materials is now open.
